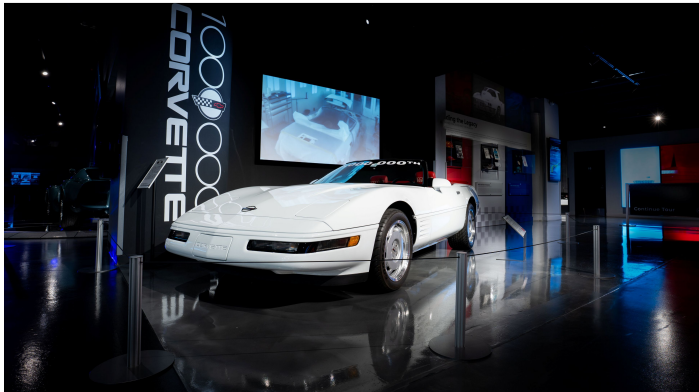


Back From Daytona

#3 Corvette C5.R Returns to Display

After a featured stop in Daytona during the Rolex 24, the #3 Chevrolet Corvette C5.R has returned to the National Corvette Museum and is now back on exhibition in the E. Pierce Marshall Memorial Performance Gallery. This GTS endurance race car runs a 7.0L naturally aspirated V8 with about 494 hp and 599 lb-ft of torque, paired with a 5-speed manual transmission and a carbon-fiber body. Driven by Andy Pilgrim, Kelly Collins, and Dale Earnhardt Sr. and Jr., it earned second in class and fourth overall at Daytona in 2001.

Rising Fast: The Collections Facility Takes Shape

Steel and concrete are quickly turning into the next major addition to the National Corvette Museum campus. Work is well underway on the new 66,000-square-foot Collections Facility, with the foundation complete, wall systems now being erected, and roof installation in progress. The project remains on schedule for planned completion in the fall of 2026, and public tours are slated to begin in spring 2027.
